

National Chi Nan University Regulations for Outstanding Alumni Selection

Approved at the 401st administrative meeting on Dec. 11, 2013

Amendments to Articles 5 and 6 approved at the 420th administrative meeting on Nov. 5, 2014

- Article 1 The Regulations for Outstanding Alumni Selection (hereafter “the Regulations”) were established by National Chi Nan University (hereafter “the University”) to reward alumni who have made special contributions to society and the country.
- Article 2 People who have completed their studies at the University and earned their degree certificate are all eligible to be a candidate for Outstanding Alumni selection.
- Article 3 The University has the following categories of Outstanding Alumni:
1. alumni who have shown outstanding academic or professional achievements
 2. alumni who have shown outstanding achievements as a business owner or group leader that warrant a reward
 3. alumni who have made great contribution through their dedication to promoting public and social welfare and to serving the country
 4. alumni who have made other achievements that enhance the University’s reputation
- Article 4 In principle, a maximum of 10 candidates will be considered for the University’s Outstanding Alumni selection for all categories every year; however, depending on the circumstances, the University may nominate more, less, or no candidates.
- Article 5 The University’s Outstanding Alumni Selection Committee (hereafter “the Committee”) comprises the University president; Dean of Student Affairs, the Dean of Academic Affairs, the Dean of General Affairs, the deans of all colleges of the University, four reputable society elites nominated jointly by the colleges; two alumni representatives nominated jointly by the director and members of the University’s Alumni Association. The Committee consists of 15 members and serves a term of one year. The University president serves as the Committee convener; Dean of Student Affairs the vice convener; and director of the Career and Alumni Service Center the executive secretary. Upon invitation, the president of the Student Association may attend the selection process. The Committee members must not be a candidate of Outstanding Alumni.

If a Committee member is nominated as a candidate of Outstanding Alumni, they will be automatically removed from the Committee. The convener shall be notified of the removal of Committee member and determine how the Committee will conduct the by-election.

Article 6 Outstanding Alumni shall be nominated through the following means:

1. Eligibility of the nominating person or unit:

- (1) Nomination by the University's or the particular department's Alumni Association, after which a resolution will be made by the University's Alumni Association at a meeting regarding which candidate to nominate. The ranked list of the nominees will then be submitted to the Committee for further deliberation.
- (2) Joint nomination by three or more full-time faculty members from each department of the University.
- (3) Joint nomination by five or more reputable social elites.
- (4) Joint nomination by 10 or more alumni.
- (5) Nomination by directors of authorities or university presidents

Those nominated through methods described in (2)–(5) shall be subjected to resolution at the particular college's meeting, and the final ranked list of nominees shall be submitted to the Committee for further deliberation.

2. Deadline of nomination:

Those who wish to nominate shall complete one copy of the Outstanding Alumni Nomination Form and submit it to the University's Career and Alumni Service Center by March 15 each year.

Article 7 Elected individuals of the Outstanding Alumni selection will be publicly awarded an Outstanding Alumni medal at the graduation ceremony each year, and their outstanding achievements will be published in the University's press.

Article 8 The Regulations were promulgated and implemented after approval in an administrative meeting.
